3. Member of Stanford University's inaugural class.

4. Self-made millionaire. The source of wealth was mining and gold.

5. His wife, Lou Henry was from Waterloo, also a graduate of Stanford, carried her own .38 caliber, and was good at archery.

6. Led efforts to bring Americans home at the start of WW I. Gave up his career in Engineering and concentrated in feeding the starving.

7. Was a great humanitarian, serving over 8 million starving individuals in 57 countries.

8. Served as Secretary of Commerce and starred in the first TV broadcast in American history.

9. His first elective position was as President of the U.S., which he won by a landslide.

10. FDR did not want Hoover involved in helping out to resolve the depression, because FDR wanted all the credit for himself.

Other facts – Hoover was Quaker born, humble about his wealth, traveled around the world 8 times attending to mining business, did not take a Presidential salary, was very generous, supported a school in Appalachia, enjoyed the outdoors, and enjoyed coming back to Iowa. Notably, President Hoover believed that local communities could do a better job at helping themselves versus the government stepping in.
