


Prez Sez

Steve Bass Urbandale School District

Steve Bass came to Urbandale as superintendent six years ago from the Osage School District. He is planning to retire at the end of this year.

Urbandale is the 32nd largest district in the state and one of the smallest 4A schools in the state. It has one of the largest open enrollments with 900 inbound open-enrolled students.

Steve thanked the district for support in passing the referendum in 2018. That has helped with many infrastructure improvements. They have added safety entrances at the fronts of buildings. They have completed a fitness center that benefits hundreds of students. It is listed as one of the top ten high school fitness centers and weight rooms in the country.

Two new elementary schools are being built. Olmsted is entirely new and almost complete. The other one is the new Valerius building. Both are two-story and will serve approximately 450-500 students. Rolling Green will eventually be closed. The plans for that site are not yet determined.

The Urbandale city pool is being removed from land leased from the school. The decision has not been made as to whether to replace it. The land use will revert to the school district.

The pandemic has presented stressful times as Steve personally answered over 8000 COV-ID-related emails, himself. The experience of remote learning had mixed results. There was a surprising number of benefits because it forced students to be accountable for their time and work and it reduced disciplinary issues, allowing many student to do better. Zoom has been a tremendous benefit, but Steve is about Zoomed out.
