- Presbyopia-Aging of the eye effects near vision, constricts the pupil. New medicine Vuity-recycled drops that was previously used for glaucoma. Some side effects.
- Myopia Management Approved treatment. There has been an epidemic of near sightedness in children. There are contact lenses to slow progression up to 50% also, Atropine drops and Ortho K glasses to help with this condition.
- Diabetes and the Eye- Leading cause of blindness in adults. Retinopathy, diabetic macular treatment, intravitreal injections, lasers and vitreal therapy, lasers.
- Cataracts-Clouded Lenses. Surgery which implants a lense in the correction for this however there are different quality of lenses which are different types of surgeries and have different types of results and vision post -surgery. It is said that Rembrandt later in life perspective was muted by his cataracts.

- Lid Hygiene Wendy emphasized the importance and the effectiveness as a preventive measure. Regular hygiene of your eyelid removes biofilm, debris, bacteria and even eyelid mites (Demodex). There are wipes that help and drops such as xdemy that can be a part of your hygiene routine.
- Dry Eye The sting, burn, sensitive ot light, blurred vision and feeling like something is in your eye that you often get. It is an unhealthy membrane gland that is depleted. There are many new treatments for dry eyes: pulse light treatments, thermal treatments, eye drops, tyrvaya nasal spray, and even injections.

Wendy concluded by talking about the development in lenses: digital lenses to provide a more precise, wider field of vision and office lenses for multiple screens vision clarity.
