Ames Day Camps providing quality day care for some of the 50,000 Iowa children who have no access to day care. Scholarships are available through partnerships with a wide variety of organizations.

Camp Hantesa, with summer day camps and overnight camps, has Leadership camp for grades 9 & Damp; 10, Appentice Camp where 11 th & Damp; 12 th graders can become licenced day care providers, Camp Brave for Youth impacted by crime, and a camp for refugees.

They host Volunteer Days where corporate partners volunteer. Those partnerships also yield additional benefits to Camp Fire. Upcoming projects are replacement of their swinging bridge, pool repairs, and a new climbing wall. Kelly finds that corporations are not giving through United Way as its admin cost is too high. That requires Camp Fire to make direct funding appeals such as the recent S'Mores and Pours event that raised \$6000. It is coming up again on September 14.

Little known fact: Rice Krispie treats were first created at a Camp Fire event. The biggest change over Kelly's career is the ubiquitousness of electronics, especially cell phones. Camp Fire Camps are "Cell phone free" zones. The other big change is increase of helicopter parents, especially in private camping. Her favorite career moments came while she was in bi-lingual education where she saw people, generally from Mexico, who had success and were so proud of their achievements and the impact they had in giving their kids success in the United States.

Kudos, Kelly, for a great career!


