

events, a farmer's market, the state high school baseball, tournament (with limited seating) and a Father's Day event. In addition, they hosted various virtual events and podcasts.

Because so many minor league clubs had to lay off their work staff when the 2021 season came around and it was time to play ball, many teams had to scramble to get enough employees for opening day. The Iowa Cubs were fully staffed and ready to roll at the beginning of the season on May 4, after a 604-day hiatus.

Some COVID related items to note about the reopening:

Make sure to bring your debit or credit card. Cash will no longer be accepted at the park. Two ATM machines will be available inside Principal Park near the fan services center behind home plate. The machines allow fans to exchange cash for a pre-paid Mastercard that also can be used outside of Principal Park. Cubbie dollars will continue to be accepted.

The game program also has gone digital. QR codes will be around the park to download it for free.

The Cubs will use a digital ticketing system to scan smart phones. Print-at-home options are available but hand-held fickets will be a thing of the past. Fans can use the digital ticketing system to share tickets with friends by email.

Our thanks to Beth for speaking to us and filling us in on the return of AAA baseball to Iowa.
