counts programs and were used in the classrooms. Today over 8,000,000 students attend the in-classroom trainings, all around the world are using the program to promote the core values and improve civility one child at a time. Everywhere the program is used the results are measured.

The 6 pillars of character are trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and good citizenship. Some of the metrics that are measured are Graduation rates, classroom attendance, math proficiency rates, and English proficiency rates. The program has many success stories from schools about how this program in improving the overall education of the children along with making them better people and citizens, One of the larger school system in California saw a major reduction in out of school suspension over a 10 year period. Starting with over 6000 and going as low as under 300 are the actual numbers that were shared. That school's system believes that the character counts program is a major reason for the improvement.

This 27 year old program that began right here in Iowa really seems to be changing the world for the better, one person at time. The goal was some lasting legacy of the Iowa Sequential and I think this program is living up to that goal in ways that were probably not even thought of every day. It will be existing to hear where things are when they turn 30.
