strengthen our community's foundations and engage in meaningful placemaking. Four cornerstones were designed as overarching focus areas for action. They include: Economic Opportunity and Prosperity, Community and Cultural Connections, Thriving Neighborhoods and Youth Investment.

Their staff is small and is funded by the community. They meet quarterly with a 44-member regional council and 5 co-chairs. They have picked 2 areas to start on this year. They are Education and Workforce housing. They plan on collaborating with other organizations to help solve the issues in the community. In the workforce collaborative, the first goal is to complete an ecosystem map that will basically identify what support exists and who they serve.
