# Micheal Wagler - Varsity Cinema

Michael Wagler, from Varsity Theater, gave a history of the Varsity through the 80 years and the redesign and historical preservation that has happened.

The building itself has housed a Studebaker company, Atlantic bottlers, and then theater since 1938.

The funds for fixing the theater (complete with an elevator) was made possible through a non profit and "main street" funding, and partial private ownership. It now features 515 seats, 2nd floor loft seating, and handicap accessible seating.

The current theater was reopened Dec. of 2022, and provides movies 7 days a week and 12 months a year. It has had 200 movies, hosted 14 film makers, has had 40,000 visitors and 6 state wide project awards. Movies are selected for their art value, diverse voice, and of course financial returns. It is supported through 2/3 ticket sales and 1/3 thru non profit of the 1,000 annual members.
