Musicians sometimes use an instrument called a tuning fork. It is a two-pronged steel device which vibrates when struck to give a note of specific or "true" pitch. Consider a tuning fork. The two tines vibrate together to create the pitch. If one

muffles either side, even a little, the note will disappear. Neither tine individually produces the sweet, pure note. Only when both tines vibrate together is the correct pitch heard.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower once said: "It is better to have one person working with you than having three people working for you." ## Andrea White - Orchard Place

Andrea White, Director of Individual and Corporate Giving, shared history and information on Orchard Place and how it transitioned from the city's first orphanage (Friendless Children) to a nationally recognized leader in children's mental health and juvenile justice services. Orchard Place is one of only a few organizations in the US that incorporates both mental health and juvenile justice services for children and adolescents. goods and services. These projects have been carried out by 339 volunteers who have given 1400 hours of service. This is truly remarkable! The Annual Fund giving to the Rotary Foundation exceeded our goal and totals nearly ten thousand dollars. In the activities of our Club which are tracked by District 6000 and Rotary International, we have achieved citation status in 24 of 33 areas for the year. These achievements include, to name a few: Service project participation; Rotarian action group participation; leadership development participation; District Conference attendance; District Training participation; Bequest Society membership; co-hosting an Exchange Student; RYLA participation and Public Image.

I am very grateful for every member who has made these achievements possible. It has been my privilege to work with a tremendous team of Officers and Directors of the Board: Brenda Auxier-Mailey, Penny Luthens, Beth Goedken, Wendi Wilson, Kasey Vogel, Ed Arnold, Bill W. Corwin, Dianne Downing, and Mark McAndrews.


from just providing residential care, as mental health grew to the top. In 2017, Orchard Place provided care to nearly 8,559 Iowa children and youth and employed 375 staff members and utilized the services of 500 volunteers. This required a budget in excess of \$21 million supported by insurance and the charitable support of a large network of individuals, groups, businesses and foundations.

The more the organization can do for a child, the better the adult experience. They are known for excellence – over 90% of their clients return home or to a lower required level of care.
