Bradford Johnson - Change Course

Our speaker for the June 23rd meeting was Brad Johnson. He represented the nonprofit company, Change Course, which helps people put their lives back together. A free education is offered, along with assistance in finding good-paying jobs.

Brad related how his father was convicted of fraud and went to prison for six months. He said he grew up hating his dad and rebelled, including using drugs and alcohol. He eventually went through rehab and therapy and his relationship with his dad has been restored, ultimately joining with him in Change Course.

The company recently conducted its first class, with seventeen people showing up and seven graduating. Graduates not only move into jobs but experience a full lifestyle change. The next class will begin on July 10 th . Fifty-four people have signed up and it is anticipated the actual number will be thirty-five. It is hoped this second class will have at least fifteen graduates.
