Brandie Broadhead - Orchard Place

Brandi's journey to her now position for almost 10 years at Orchard Place, came naturally. As a mother of a child with mental health issues, she came to Orchard Place by way of being in children's ministry, educational travel matching students to host families, and finally in the position of Family Peer Support and Life Experience; which eventually led to her current position of Director of Volunteer and Events for Orchard Place.

Some statistics around mental health and children and youth:

1 in 5 children and youth develop an emotional or behavioral disorder. 1 in 3 will get help, however average time to access treatment can be 7 years. Suicide is the 2nd highest cause of death for children and youth in Iowa. Children and youth with mental health disorders have a higher than average dropout rates. Mental health in children and youth is diagnosable and treatable. History of Orchard Place:

Originally Orchard Place was an orphanage after an infant was left at the doorstep of one of the founders. It was originally named Friends of Homeless and Orphaned Children. Original location is where Gateway Market now stands.

There was a fire at the facility and a drop of number of children served as an orphanage, with a community assessment, led to the development of a residential program for children and youth with behavioral and mental health issues. Which eventually became Orchard Place that now has three types of services.

Orchard Place's Data for 2023 6,890 kids served 335 staff 424 volunteers 90% of parents say that the therapeutic services have helped. 93% of parents are satisfied with Orchard Place's services. Orchard Place operates with a 22.98 million dollar budget. Orchard Place's Three Sites and Programs;

Child Guidance Center~ 4,000 Children and Youth Served

Mental Health Services Physiological Services-39,140 Outpatient Psych visits School Based Therapy Medicine Management

Enrichment summer camp Latino outreach Integrated health program System of care which provides an alternative to medicaid which is the majority of their qualified cases 489 served around skill building 1074 served with coordinated care services

They have a variety of events that help support Orchard Place. All which involve hundreds of volunteers and participants each year.

Shine a Light~ Bike Ride that will take place on July 13th from the Iowa Tap Room. Spelling Bee~ Their largest fundraiser that teams compete and "bribe" judges. This event raises \$70,00 a year. Rise and Shine~Drive to collect toiletries items.

They are always looking for donors, volunteers and advocates to help Orchard Place thrive in the future.
