Iowa, and various military and civilian professional development courses. He related several instances where he was able to utilize his Communication and IT skills around the world in multiple capacities through out his military career, and how those skills and experiences carried over to his civilian career.

Rob emphasized the value of cooperation among civilian employers and National Guard members during periodic emergency disaster responses and the benefits to local communities of National Guard training. Successful military – civilian partnerships are the result of: Support from local communities by providing personnel and time for Military training and deployment; recognizing the value of military training and experience; support from military families and friends; employers recognizing the value of military commitments, training and leadership; and having Guard members using their skills and training to benefit the community.
