personally and professionally. They figure out what the applicants need to develop into a successful employee and then train them to do exactly that. Programs include career cultivation, self-improvement, digital skills, and prison to workforce. These services are all free for the applicant because everyone, both employed and unemployed, are benefitted from a better job.

This last year they developed Youth Works. This program was designed to get high school students ready for the workforce. During their senior year they take class in the morning and then report to work from 2-5 PM. They can get paid and get credit at the same time. Students are trained and then matched with professional internships for 9 months. This first year East High School was the school they worked with, and 4 students completed the program.

There are a few ways we can help Project Iowa. First if you know anyone looking for a new or better job, direct them to their website. Second, if you know of a business looking for new hires or that is open to internships, contact Project Iowa and they will take it from there. Third, they are always looking for ways to diversify funding and build community here in Iowa so let them know if you can get involved!
