Bryanne Lang - MOSAIC in Central Iowa

Bryanne Lang and Katie Flippen spoke to us about MOSAIC in Central Iowa. A copy of the hand-out from their presentation at the meeting was attached to the weekly e-mail message. Both ladies have been associated with the organization for about 7 years, and became involved because they have family members who have benefited from the services MOSAIC provides. MOSAIC has it roots from back in 1913 with the Bethphage Mission in Axtell, NE. It was founded by Rev. K. G. William Dahl, using \$54 in accumulated \$1 contributions from his congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, with which it is still associated, to serve people who were forced to live on the fringes of society, due to their disabilities. It is now the largest faith-based organization that serves people on the basis of their disabilities.

MOSAIC now operates in 13 states, and has four locations in Iowa. Its first local facility was a group home set up on the east side of Des Moines in 1983; it is still in operation. MOSAIC uses a combination of group homes, host families, and non-residential services for its clients. How a client is placed and service levels determined is based on a 3-hour assessment program. MOSAIC's clients are adults, aged 18 and older. It does coordinate with Child Serve and other similar organizations, however, in order to serve the population that ages out of those programs but still requires a support system. MOSAIC is primarily funded through Medicaid.

MOSAIC has also operated a program in Tanzania for 22 years, but it has a number of differences in how it is run, due to the culture there. For example, a family with a disabled child is considered to be cursed, and a spouse (i.e. husband) may leave the family, so there is a
