Founded in 1976, YSS operates out of Ames, and serves youth and young adults in six communities across the state. While it does provide some emergency shelter services (nine beds), its main focus is to provide services in education, counseling and civility to upper-age teen clients, and to young adults who have aged out of the foster care system and been left

without any resources. YSS operates the only genderbased addiction treatment center in the state. Its services are tailored to the needs of the population, serving more than 10,000 youth a year. Its current CEO is actually a graduate of its programs!

Currently, they have two capital campaigns. Roof-top gardens, which in addition to job training - raising herbs to sell to local grocery stores - teaches soft skills such as making eye contact, giving firm handshakes and engaging in small talk. Participants are paid wages to work in the program, which is currently operating at a location on East Euclid, near the Habitat Re-store. The second project is the Ember youth recovery campus, located at exit 102 from I-35, between Ankeny and Ames. YSS plans to serve up to 700 youth a year, ages 15-24, with emergency shelter and crisis intervention. In addition to its capital campaign, YSS receives funding from federal and state governments, and provides the largest post-foster care program in the state.

The top three things youth in the program need from the community are better family support, learning how to process and cope with conflict and trauma, and public support to cover funding gaps for services. Visit the website at http://www.YSS.org

*Not to be confused with YESS, Youth Emergency Shelter Services, which in 2021 merged with Youth Homes of Mid-America and rebranded as Ellipsis Iowa. Whew!
