We built the younger age packs and ran out of pencils and erasers. We then built what we could and waited for supplies. We broke for lunch and the when Laura came back we finished the packs we had started and then called it a day. That was about 1:30pm. When I think of what we can do in 90 minutes with 6 Rotarians I am amazed. Laura was incredibly grateful for the help, and I am certain the children that get the backs packs and their parents will be as well.

Later in the week before our regular meeting, our board met with District Governor Steve Dakin. I was proud and impressed as he reviewed his questionnaire asked us about the Club. Our Club's heart for service was something I felt honored to share with Steve and Lesley Dakin. The Des Moines-area Multi-Club meeting will take place online, on Tuesday, October 20, starting at 4:30. The topic is going to be drug/substance abuse, with a panel of speakers from the community. There will not be any registration fees, nor will there be any break-out sessions. The usual "vendor" show will instead consist of videos from area service providers. The Committee is interested in getting sponsors, both to defray the few costs involved and to be able to make contributions to those same participating providers.

Bill D. is looking for a Zoom Manager to help handle the meetings we are broadcasting (which is all of them of course!).

Ed reported on the progress of polio immunization; three countries are still struggling, with too many new cases, plus the COVID pandemic has led Afghanistan to suspend immunization as it works to control that pandemic.

Our speaker was District Governor Steve Dakin, rocking his purple beard (more on that, later). Steve has been a Rotarian since 1975, when a loan officer at his bank suggested he check it out (he got the loan, too). He hails from Boone, where his club recently facilitated relocating a big train en-

engine to a highway at the entrance to town, and now a park surrounding it is in development. Steve firmly believes that Rotarians must have FUN, hence his weekly message of encouragement and amusement.

Steve's goal is to launch four satellite clubs this year – that is, new clubs of 15 or so members, launched by "parent" clubs. These are meant to appeal to members who might not fit into the traditional meeting mode. Boone just launched one, and it even recruited members from his own club, who needed to accommodate changes in job schedules. This also fits in with a new idea in Rotary, to promote cause-based clubs: many of the new satellite club members are school teachers. Rotary has added a new, seventh area of focus, the environment, which also fits the cause-based concept.

Steve is very attuned to the philosophies of the new RI President, Holger Knaack, who is particularly interested in youth and their concerns; Mr. Knaack and his his wife have hosted many international exchange students in their home, and Steve thinks RYLA is an outstanding program for producing future leaders in the community: watch the kids take charge!

About that purple beard: Steve wears it to honor the purple pinkie, which is used to identify children who have been immunized from polio; this prevents them from circling around at an immunization event to get another dose, since the volunteers tend to encourage participation by handing out trinkets. One to a customer!
