Vote Smart created/utilize a document called "Side by Side." m.pIt is a document that allows you to compare and contrast candidates in the fields such as candidates' biographical data, voting records, special interest group ratings, and public statements.

The information is online and very easy to use. To view a particular candidate's information, go to www. sbs.votesmart.org; Enter the candidate's name in the search bar, and click on their name to add them below. Repeat this process for as many candidates as you want to add. According to Aline Costa, "Side by Side provides users the powers of our database and its millions of facts in one simple tool."

In 2022, Vote Smart created a document called the voter's self-defense manual. It is a simple book in the hands of the public that provides a powerful advantage over the liars, manipulations, and cheats that seek to disempower you.

Vote Smart is a membership organization that collects donations from the public to support its operations.
