Steve Franklin - Urbandale Community Development

On Friday, NWDM Rotarians were treated to a very informative presentation by the Director of Urbandale Community Development, Steve Franklin. Steve has served as Director for the past five years. A special

census is conducted by the City of Urbandale every five years. In 2000 Urbandale's population was 29,072. By the year 2020 the population had grown to 45,580. Urbandale's growth has mainly been to the west and now stretches all the way out to 184th Street. With the current Corporate Limits, Urbandale's population will top out at approximately 70,000 residents.

Population growth is closely aligned with residential construction. Residential construction cannot happen without final plats being proposed and approved by the City of Urbandale. Currently there are 200 to 300 lots created each year allowing a 2- to 3-year inventory for developers and housing for new home buyers. In 2019, 84 final plats were approved. In 2020 there were 306 and in 2021, 232.

What has changed most recently, allowing more construction, has been the size of lots being approved and the permit approval process. In the past, lots had to have a minimum frontage width of 80 to 100 feet. Lots being approved today are 46 - 50 feet wide. Smaller lots are cheaper, and the home being built is smaller. Smaller homes are less expensive, creating more affordable housing opportunities. The Community Development Department has
