first grandchild. Our Club was the 41st club visited in their quest to visit all 70+ clubs in the district. Dave had some great stories he shared to define Magic or Rotary that were incredible. Quoting Ralph Waldo Emerson, "an oak tree contains thousands of forests in each acorn". He made the comparison that from the first Rotary club we have grown to 36,000 clubs with over 1.2 million members in over 20 countries. Dave brought the Magic of Rotary home to each member by reminding us the Roary's magic is each member and what we do to practice Service above Self in our own lives and our clubs activities.

Here are those goals for this year. District Goal is to achieve the first net increase in membership in over a decade. Our goal is to increase our membership by 3 members to reach 24 members. The district would like to add 4 extension clubs this year in the district. District 6000 has more extension clubs than any district in the world and they have been a boost to club membership everywhere they have been added. A third district goal is to reduce the loss of newer members. District wide a 15% reduction in loss of new members would increase membership this year by 130 members this year alone. Lots if ideas on how to engage new members were discussed. Involvement in the club's ongoing activities and asking new members where there passions are and building project around them are some of the ideas.

There is a dinner on Nov 15th at the World Food Prize Hall of Laureates in Des Moines. National speakers from Rotary will be speaking at the dinner. Dave and Lisa left us a challenge to try something new this year to make your club better and a big thank you for our spirit of giving and 55+ legacy of service above self.
