Mark McAndrews - RYLA

Club member Mark McAndrews gave the Club an overview of Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) in District 6000. RYLA started as a one-time event in 1959 as part of a Royal Visit to Queensland Australia commemorating the Centennial of the founding of the province. After the first year there was such a demand that it became an ongoing celebration. By 1971 Rotary International recognized RYLA as a Rotary project.

RYLA can be organized by a club, a district or multiple districts. For several decades, RYLA in District 6000 was a one-day event held at Camp Dodge. Six years ago District 6000 decided to revamp RYLA and examined multiple models for RYLA all over the US. We settled on a model implemented by RYLA of the Rockies, a five-day format run by multiple districts at the YMCA Camp in Estes Park, Colorado. Fortunately, District 5970 had just adopted that format two years previously and we were able to form a partnership between our districts to jointly sponsor RYLA. Over the past six years RYLA has grown from 50 students to 240 (our capacity at Grinnell College).

The first key to RYLA is learning a bit about your own personal leadership style and attributes. Through a couple of personality surveys, conferees learn what motivates them, how they interact with others, how they take in information, and how they make decisions. Understanding yourself and others is a key skill in forming effective teams.

Another key of RYLA is that leadership is learned through experience and practice. Conferees are assigned to a team of 12 conferees (none of whom know each other), led by a counselor (a conferee from a prior year) and supported by a Rotarian. The majority of the week is spent in this small group engaged in activities to create learning opportunities.

Testimonials from conferees, parents, teachers and Rotarians verify RYLA is a truly life changing experience. Conferees return better leaders who to teach the skills they have learned in all of the organizations they are a part of.

In the opinion of this scribe, Mr. McAndrews gave an excellent presentation.
