Then, recently, when our hopes were high, a stumbling block- outbreaks of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus, yes- a variant... and yet, we persisted. With Rotary's partnership with the Gates Foundation a modified vaccine was developed, tested, and now "provides hope that eradication is closer than ever." With World Polio Day approaching on October 24th, maybe consider an extra donation to Polio Plus? I am going to ask the Board if we can double our speaker's donation towards immunizing children that week, maybe even take a collection to further our club's support. In the meantime...how about that flu shot?

I am sorry I cannot be with you this week, I am on my first out-of-state road trip to Kansas City for work. They tell me it's a "straight shot and impossible to get lost," we'll see about that. But that is a story for another time. Thanks to Jack for handling the meeting.

Brooke Heldt - YMCA Supportive Housing

The YMCA started the Supportive Housing Campus in the 90's as the social responsibility portion of their organization. They operate around the three pillars of Hope, Dignity, and Support. They offer transitional housing for those at risk for homelessness on a dry campus.

The housing is considered transitional because many of their 140 residents will spend an average of 18 months living in the community. About 15 residents have made it their home since it opened. About 40% of the residents are veterans and receive preference on the nearly year-long wait list for openings. The community is designed as a hand up, not a hand out, so accountability is paramount. Each resident is assigned a case manager who helps them set, meet and achieve goals and simultaneously learn to manage money.

Each room is a monthly rental for residents with a sliding scale for rent. Transportation service is available to help them get to jobs or interviews. Because they are located downtown, low-cost shopping for necessities can be difficult, so the building has an onsite pantry they can purchase from. They have a community yard with a garden and a place to grill. Monday through Friday food opportunities are available to help them stretch their food budget and three days a week limited emergency food bags are available. Every resident gets a move-in package with necessities like pans, kitchen stuff, and laundry detergent.

They continue to offer support to their "graduates" as they transition by allowing them to use the amenities available to them when living in. They also can continue to work with their case manager.

They raise about \$185K a year to provide for the current residents. They welcome donations of money, pantry items, welcome basket supplies and hygiene products, as well as volunteers.
