First, hopefully the map is attached but we will need to meet at the guard station (blue and white star on the map) this is where our tour will start. Also on the map is where we are allowed to park (the black and white P's) right by the Denman Memorial Fountain. Last thing on the map is where



you will enter the park at (Blue and White Car). Also, a heads up you MUST HAVE your ID to enter so please remember to bring some form of ID because you will need it for the tour.

Second, unfortunately due to the length of the tour there will be NO food so please be sure to eat beforehand. ## Emily Roeder Hoyt Sherman Place

Todays speaker was Emily Roeder the Education Program Coordinator with Hoyt Sherman Place.



Emily came to Hoyt Sheman Place recently from the DM Public schools. Emily walked us through the history of the facility. It started out as the Family home of Hoyt Sherman. The home construction was completed in 1877. It was noted to be a "Society showplace of the grandest scale". The Sherman's (Hoyt and his wife Sara) raised 5 children in the home. When Major Hoyt Sherman passed away in 1907 the home was transferred to his heirs. They later transferred the home to the city of Des Moines with the caveat it always be called Hoyt Sherman Place.

In 1893 the home was the first Mercy hospital. The sisters of Mercy for Davenport created a 52-room hospital facility with all the surgeries being done in the basement. In 1907 the Des Moines Women's club leased the one for \$1.00 a year and began meeting at the home. The Des Moines Women's club sill meets there every Wednesday October through may. The Des Moines Women's club built a gallery adjacent to the mansion in 1885.

In 1977 it was listed on the National register of historic places. Over the years there have been additions and remodels, and an association was formed to oversee the facilities is maintenance and mission. After over 100 years and several additions and remodels, Hoyt Sherman place host over 100 shows a year in the theatre, Art classes year round for adults and children, the art gallery, the restored mansion and Des Moines History displays is open 8-5 M-F for visits and tours it is also available for weddings and events.


