This past Saturday I attended the Rotary Leadership Institute (also known as “RLI”) training in Mount Pleasant. As most of you know, this initiative is led by our Immediate Past District Governor, Steve Wienke. RLI is a grassroots, multi-district leadership development program whose mission is to strengthen Rotary clubs through quality leadership education. It's currently a 3-level course, and I “graduated”, along with 2 other Rotarians, on Saturday.

When I signed up for Level 1 I thought it might be a good primer (it was), and possibly a requisite (it was not) for a year of presidential – or any club-level leadership - responsibilities. Level 1 was an excellent survey of topics such as a general overview of Rotary (still useful even after 8 years as a member in two clubs), the Foundation, engaging members (unfortunately an ever-green topic), service projects and the important topic of grants – of both the community service and international variety. Level 2 builds on these topics with a bit more emphasis on strategic planning for clubs and Level 3 wraps things up by delving deeper into topics such as PR and international service, with a return visit to the Foundation.

I recall time with strategic planning and leadership sessions in my previous life at Andersen and then at Deloitte. While the content was always useful (at least in theory) and the time it took to prepare as a facilitator demanded respectful attention, it was the relationship-building, and getting to know colleagues outside of the formal work environment that is the memory that remains the most vivid to this day.

I feel the same with RLI...by the end of Level 3 I've come to know my course-mates and fellow Rotarians to such an extent that I was a bit sad as we said goodbye. I would recommend all three levels to anyone wanting to learn more about Rotary and leadership in general.

Amber Lewis - DM Homeless Policy Administration



Our October 6 Rotary meeting speaker was Amber Lewis who was recently hired by the City of Des Moines as its first Homeless Policy Administrator. She previously served as the homeless programs manager for the State of Iowa.

In her new role with the city, she develops recommendations for Homeward which is the homelessness planning organization for Polk County.

Amber said the greatest need in Polk County is housing support. About 700 are on the list, of which there are about 90 with children. She cited several organizations that provide some form of housing support. She also indicated that a Homeless Coordinating Council meets periodically during the year.

A Club member asked if there is a “Guide” for available programs and services that a Church could use. Amber said the County doesn't have such a document, but United Way might be able to provide such information.
