When refugees arrive to the US, most of the programs are designed for the families and parents and the youth. Parents arrive in survival mode and don't understand the value of extracurricular activities. Most of the parents are illiterate and are just happy their kids get to go to school. In Africa, discipline is done in the schools and not at home, so the youth need direction and focus to become productive citizens.

Genesis focuses on soccer and the arts. They use these as a hook to get the youth involved, then provide academic support, and a bridge for the school system. They work to close the academic gap the youth are placed in as they arrive in America. Genesis has 125 youth from West Des Moines in the program.

Covid 19 The Arthurs & The Pandemic

Jeanella and I moved into the independent living part of Brio of Johnston about a year and a half ago. We left our townhome on the lake with reluctance, but figured that it was time to make the move. Brio is a part of the Wesley Life Network, which includes Brio, Edgewater, Wesley Acres, The Village in Indianola and 7 other communities. We are glad we made the move, because of the opportunities here for exercise, socializing, and healthy eating. We chose Brio because it is midway between the families of our daughter Anne in Grimes and our son (Pat!) in Johnston.

When COVID-19 struck, the staff at Brio took the necessary measures. This included wearing masks when not in our apartments, closing the dining room and delivering meals to our apartments, suspending group activities and halting visits from our families and friends. There have now been no cases of COVID-19 in the independent living area for about 3 months and we are resuming some group activities while continuing to take the necessary precautions.

Within the first couple of months of the pandemic, we lost several friends and acquaintances to the virus. Some of these were from our church, some here at Brio, and there were others who we have known in the Johnston community. One was a friend of over 50 years, another was the husband of a couple we had befriended here at Brio. His wife had to quarantine, so she was alone much of the time after his death. We have been able to visit our local families outside or in their garages. Both our daughter and daughter-in-law teach, so we have been even more careful around them since school resumed. We visit with all 5 of our kids, and their families once a week on Zoom.

The two of us are actually doing quite well, doing a lot of reading, working jigsaw puzzles, exercising and watching lots of movies. I miss being a part of the actual Rotary meetings, but am glad to see and hear from you at the Zoom meetings. I hope to be back with you soon.
