# Covid & Rotarians Mark McAndrews



COVID has perhaps affected me much less than the average person. I have been self-employed and working from a home office since 1995, thus no changes for me on that front. My wife was already devoting her time to rais-

ing our two boys, so when they were sent home to finish the year remotely it wasn't as disruptive as for most families. I already had my space, and other than a bit of noise management, we adjusted relatively easily.

I had been working remotely with my primary client for years. The team I worked with was used to me being a voice on a conference call, but none of them had worked remotely. They were all sent to work from home and it was a huge adjustment for the whole team. My client was already in the process of phasing out some older tools and moving all remote work to MicroSoft Teams and Zoom, and COVID accelerated that migration. While the technology is in place, our whole team had lessons to learn about communication. Our team found that not being in the same physical space reduced some of the "coffee station" interactions that



provide some synergy that is not noticed until it is absent. Some casual and some directed meetings needed to be scheduled just to keep folks interacting and discovering what was happening in other parts of the organization. I believe the upgrade in technology and the familiarity employees have with it will pay dividends far into the future.

I have been baking sourdough bread for years. That wasn't a new skill for me brought on by COVID, but I sure had to adjust my recipe / technique a couple of times, as all the newcomers emptied the shelves of my favorite bread flour (and then almost all flour).

I had an aunt pass away in early June. Her funeral would have normally been a long weekend of family gathering to celebrate her life. We had to make do with a couple of hours – grave-side service, socially distanced and then family gathering outdoors for some socially-distanced sharing. Just not what we normally do. I have also "attended" four funerals that were on-line early in the pandemic (limited to 10 in-person attendees). Those just lacked the community that had always been my experience with celebrating a life. Those were really tough.

My younger son is dyslexic. As we were preparing for his annual IEP meeting, we reviewed the past year's goals and progress and came to the conclusion that he was not meeting his potential in his current environment. To make a long story short, he is now enrolled in a school in Kansas City that caters to students with language-based learning challenges. Finding the right school, going through the admissions process, finding an apartment and a whole host of other tasks were both challenging and so much easier than it would have been only four months earlier. The technology and processes that everyone has adopted to accommodate COVID has made this transition more manageable.


