David Kilpatrick has been executive director of the Des Moines Playhouse since May 2017. The Playhouse Mission is to create extraordinary shared experiences through live theater. The playhouse values are to promote safe cultural and artistic integrity, to be accessible, to bring people together and to honor each person's unique contributions.

The Playhouse has operated continuously since 1919. The Kendall years were 1927 when they bought a building on 35 th street with gift from the governor of the state of Iowa. That

In 1953, the Playhouse moved to the Roosevelt Movie House. They have added space about every 10 years since then including the Children's Theater in 1995. In 2018 they started major renovation when the space was literally falling down. In 2021, the Children's Theater was renovated. That project grew into a multimillion dollar project including an administration section on the new 2d floor level. They will be opening the new Children's Theater in November as the Studio Theater.

During the Pandemic, they did not want to do nothing. So they had 3 plays and a children's theater in drive-in setting. In the winter they moved back into the theater maintaining safe social distances. In 2021, they did "tent theater."

2024 is the 106 th season. They are currently presenting Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors. The Christmas presentation will be Beauty & Diary of A Wimpy Kid, Men on Boats (a story of exploration of the men on the Colorado River Trail with all parts played by women), Jesus Christ Superstar, Waitress, and Four Children's Theater plays.

When you attend the Playhouse, you are buying local as opposed to attending the Civic Center. They have 700 volunteers. Participation by anyone is encouraged. Supporters include the City of Des Moines and private support primarily from individuals. Their Penguin Project enables persons with handicaps to play major rolls with supporting persons at their side to make the project work. The first play was "Annie."

On June 25, 2025, they will be hosting the National Community Theatre Conference. Competitors have 10 minutes to set up, 60 minutes to perform, 10 minutes to tear down. Contests start at state and regional levels before May. Nationals include 9 entries from the US and one from Germany.
