We were ready, and then, as if somehow reprising the fall of three years ago, COVID reappeared and CFUM went back to the "grab and go" service as opposed to sit-down meal that we all were ready to continue. So, this Monday, Ed once again stopped by HyVee - who generously provided boxes full of sandwiches, fruit, a drink, chips, and a treat – loaded up his car and brought everything to the church. I brought our exchange student Juan along to help and we served nearly 80 individuals in less than an hour.

One of the CFUM leaders, Darlena, was there and told me she's been involved since 1996. CFUM has become a valuable staple in that neighborhood, through Supper Club, Breakfast Club, and several after-school "havens" for the students across the street at Moulton. I always enjoy my time there, am heartened by the impact CFUM has in the area and am proud that Rotary is associated with such an impactful group.

# Mark Kriegshauser - Soybean & Carbon Capture

Mark Krieghauser gave an interesting talk about how Benson-Hill is working in agriculture to develop protein from soybeans using advancements in breeding and DNA that can result in a protein replacement that will taste and have the same characteristics of actual meat or protein. The financial advantage provides a protein replacement when the country and company can't afford the actual beef. This is accomplished using AI algorithms to pull and develop the characteristics so that the product looks like/tastes like the actual protein/ or beef.

Benson-Hill has a crushing plant in nearby Creston, Iowa. Farmers can raise the products and use the land stewardship with NON- GMO seeds and their resulting crop is then processed/ crushed at the Creston plant.
