Tony Montgomery - Home Inc. Affordable Housing

Transforming lives, strengthening communities.

The NW Rotary Club's speaker on Friday was Tony Montgomery, executive director of Home, Inc. Tony provided an excellent presentation of their organization. Home Inc. has a vision such that every person is to have a place to call home.

As Mr. Montgomery provided in his presentation, Home Inc., was founded in 1967 through the efforts of citizens concerned about the lack of descent, affordable housing. This is also the oldest private, non-profit housing organization in Des Moines and currently has 11 employees. They develop affordable housing, counsel individuals and families so they obtain and retain housing and provide education to tenants, landlords and home buyers.

Their mission is to assist individuals and families struggling to make ends meet. With the rising costs of rent, food, fuel, and other necessities, they had a 20% increase this past year.

In 2022 they expanded affordable homeownership options for low-moderate income households, investing nearly \$1 million in construction, improvements, and repairs in low-income neighborhoods. Additionally, they have started building an accessory dwelling unit on a Home, Inc. property that can accommodate multi-generational households or even provide families a source of rental income.

Mr. Montgomery shared some of the staggering statistics of those in need within our community. Nearly 58,000 households in the Des Moines are cost-burdened, spending more than 30% of their income on housing. High demand, limited availability and rising rental and mortgage rates have made accessing housing challenging. According to the (2022) Iowa Housing Profile, National Low Income Housing Coalition), the are 98,194 extremely low-income renter households.

With the services that Home, Inc. provides through their education, counseling, housing development, they have been able to assist 2650 tenants, 1159 landlords and distributed \$1,245,247 in funding. Through the continued support of many generous community leaders, businesses and individuals, they can continue to reach their vision of providing the necessary homes so many need.
