Jordan Richardson Des Moines Foundation

How does a charitable foundation thrive in the midst of global pandemic? Jordan Richardson, the director of charitable giving and the charter advisor of philanthropy with the Greater Des Moines Community Foundation visited the Rotary Club of Northwest Des Moines with an answer.

They responded to the pandemic by starting a Disaster Recovery Fund. This fund has helped to raise more than one million dollars for the fund and to increase overall donor giving by forty percent during the COVID-19 crisis of 2020. These funds have been distributed to thirteen grant recipients who have demonstrated their priority of responding to the needs of the health crisis. Some of these organizations include Iowa Food Bank, Des Moines Pastoral Counseling, Des Moines Area Religious Council, Primary Health Care, Lutheran Social Services, Urban Dreams and Broadlawns Hospital.

The Foundation has a long history of managing funds for bringing people and resources together for the good of the community. There are currently 2000 charitable funds in the Foundation. The largest fund is the BetterTogether Fund with thirty-nine affiliates participating. The Foundation boasts \$650 million of assets which has made possible \$51.4 million for grants and \$78.7 million in gifts during 2019, which was their largest financial year on record.

The Foundation is more accessible to a variety of donors due to its unique tools that remove barriers often present in other foundations, namely there are no fund minimums and there are

opportunities to donate to "seed funds." In this way, the Foundation is able connect a variety of donors to various causes.



Rotary of Northwest Des Moines Help Make Students Warm & Cozy

Over the past seven years, the Rotary Club of Northwest Des Moines has purchased and distributed 2,492 winter coats to students. Since 2014, our club has been determined to keep kids warm during our long Iowa Winters. Starting in 2014, our club provided coats to students in Urbandale Schools (Rolling Green, Olmsted, Valerius, Karen Acres, Jensen, and Webster Elementary Schools; Urbandale Middle School; Urbandale High School and Metro West Learning Academy [serving students from the Urbandale, Johnston, Waukee, Saydel, Adel and Dallas Center-Grimes School Districts]). In 2015, St. Pius X Catholic School was added and in 2017, West Des Moines School, Clive Learning Center, and Des Moines Public School, Cowles Montessori located in Windsor Heights were added.

This year our club was able to provide 684 coats to preschool, elementary, middle, and high school students. To purchase the coats we partner with Operation Warm (https://www.operationwarm. org/), a nonprofit organization that provides coats at a significant discount. Operation Warm's mission is to "provide brand new winter coats to children in need, helping to improve self-confidence, peer acceptance, school attendance, and overall wellness."

On the day the coats were distributed parents and students in our community expressed their appreciation. One little girl said, "I love it...I feel like a princess!" Two middle school students commented that the coats were so cute and picked identical coats to show that they were best friends. After receiving a new coat a third-grade boy at Karen Acres excitedly stated "This is the best coat ever! It's so warm!" A first-grade girl at Valerius said, "Thank you for my coat, it is so beautiful!" A mother of four children stated "Thank you for helping us with coats for my kids. It helps me a lot!"

To fund Operation Warm our club relies on the profits of raffle ticket sales and two yearly tournaments, a Pickleball tournament at Smash Park, and a Golf Tournament at Urbandale Golf and Country Club. This year our club also received a much-needed \$5,000 grant from Endow Urbandale (https://endowurbandale.org) to purchase the additional coats needed to keep kids warm this Winter.

With the COVID 19 pandemic, there are many needs in our community, providing brand new warm coats to Urbandale's Pre K-12 students is one way our Rotary Club can make a difference.
