Rotary Friendship Exchange information was presented by Goran Stenson, representing District 2340, from Sweden. Each visiting member talked about their own town and celebrations, types of foods, and famous Swedish movie stars that the United States is familiar with. The group talked about companies that do business with the US in the area of robotics. This was followed by an exchange of flags from each group member with our own club.

The second speaker was Mike Wallace from the Dallas County Conservation service. Mike educated us about the Raccoon Valley Trail that has been in existence 20 years. The trail originally from Waukee to Yale, is a 34 trek, and is part of the American Discovery Trail. It is now 56 miles from Clive through Jefferson. The stimulus money was used to resurface the trail this summer. Another addition has been the TEAS, emergency access location markers along the trail. If someone needed help it gives the emergency responders a specific location.

The future efforts will be working on a 33 mile addition from Perry, through Dawson, Jamaica and Herndon to create another loop within the trail. There are also shelters and additions along the trail for riders to get in out of the rain, or out of the sun. One of the newest is the Dawson Depot. The small towns hope that folks stop and get acquainted and meet the local people. They were hoping to complete the new addition with \$850,000 dollars, and part of that has been funded through Vision Iowa \$, but funds are still needed to complete this regional trail concept.

Taking a few words from RI President John Kenny;


"There are many service organizations in the world today, but none so old or so successful as Rotary.
