Moodle Expert

West Des Moines School District 8th grade teacher, Sara Krzyczkowski, presented our program. Sara was introduced to our meeting by Urbandale Principal and NW Rotary Member, Julia Taylor.

Sara started her program with a technical video explaining what has happened in the world of technology in such a short period of time. Wikipedia was once considered not a reliable resource on the web, but today it is more accurate than the Encyclopedias in our libraries. It is being updated constantly.

Young elementary students really get technology. They have grown up with computers, cell phones, and all other fast pace technology. However, they may not yet understand how to effectively use this technology.

That's where Moodle comes to play. In a Moodle environment, learning takes place 24/7. Students are able to access

their tests, assignments, studies at school and from their home computer. Teachers are able to immediately tell the student that their answers are right and wrong. To show them the right answers and this reinforces their learning. Students are able to reassess their work and after dialogue and analysis, they may retake an exam after better understanding and improve their grade. Moodle is a free software program designed for on-line instruction and give and take between teacher, student and student to student.

All of this is made available as free, open source virtual learning environment that originated in Australia. The Urbandale School District hosts the district's program on separate district servers, so all of the tools are safe and accessible only to students within the Urbandale district. There are a number of tools to help students learn, including chat rooms, forums for students to discuss ideas, and wikis...which is allowing students to edit a document, similar to Wikipedia.
