The October 23, 2009 NW Rotary of Des Moines meeting was held at the Urbandale Golf and Country Club. The Invocation was given by Dave Nagel and the Sergeant duties were adequately performed by Rick Grant using the theme of "Support your local football team". Two visiting Rotarians were in attendance; Bruce Kelly from DM Noon and Jim Riordan from Waukee. Mr. Riordan later met with Jim Arthur to discuss a possible joint overseas water project or hospital project. Several guests attended, including; Jan Herke -Urbandale Parks and Recreation (Gene Gabus), Tim Sitzman - Mr. B's Clothing (Dave Smith) and Brenda Auxier-Mailey - Urbandale Schools (Julia Mark McAndrews formally Taylor). announced the birth of George Thomas McAndrews at 9lbs 13 oz. Mary Francis McAndrews and the baby are doing very well. Beth Goedken won the drawing.

Our program speaker was arranged by Brad Helgamo. A.J. Johnson, Urbandale presented City Manager, some background material on his professional career, and where the City of Urbandale has been and where we are headed. He and his wife are both Des Moines natives and are glad to be back in the area. "Urbandale and indeed, the State face some challenging times," although the City has many reasons for pride and optimism. Urbandale was ranked the 42nd best city under 50,000 population by CNN and Money Magazine, one of a few selected for 6 straight years. Urbandale has managed to keep property taxes low, while maintaining infrastructure and services. Urbandale is the second fastest city, behind Ankeny in new housing starts

for the last 10 years, and sales are beginning to improve again. The 12th largest city at 38,900, Urbandale has current capacity (infrastructure) to support a population of 72,000. ...continued...

Avenues of Service


The term Avenues of Service refers to the four parts of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, and International Service.

- International Service
- And this months topic...Vocational Service.

Vocational Service describes the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and value of his or her vocation to the other members of the club, as well as the responsibility of the club to undertake projects related to such areas as career planning, vocational training, and the promotion of high ethical standards in the workplace.
