Peace Studies and Conflict Resolution


Four years ago, in an effort to do something more than just talk about world peace, Rotary established six Centers for Peace Studies and Conflict Resolution around the globe - two in the United States.

Each year up to 60 scholars at the master's degree

level are sponsored to study at one of these seven sites.

In 2006-07, 50 new scholars from 27 countries received \$4.3 million for the two year program.

The goal is to advance knowledge and world understanding among potential future leaders of government, business, education, media and other professions.
