Rob SmithBuilding A Better Iowa

Our meeting of October 30 was graced by a new, high tech lectern. It was a gift to the club from Dr. Marvin Johnson. Thanks Mary!

Ed Arnold announced that we will have an event in the Hospitality Suite at Wells Fargo Arena before the Polio Plus Iowa Energy Fund Raiser on January 23.

Jim Lipscomb reported that we fed 123 people at the CFUM supper at Trinity Church last Monday. This included 67 children, many of whom might not have gotten a good dinner otherwise.

Our speaker, Rob Smith, is co-owner of the Smith Metzger architectural firm. Rob addressed us about the need to improve our buildings so that they are more environmentally friendly. Buildings in this country are the leaders in energy consumption at 48% or our total usage, far more than vehicles or any other category. There are systematic ways to improve the efficiency of buildings and reduce their environmental footprint. The U. S. Green Building Council is working to make green buildings available to

everyone. We can all assist in reducing our impact on the environment and in conserving ever more precious resources. Actions we can take include: 1) Buy local. Rob opened his talk with the description of the shipment of 5000 tons of granite from Brazil, where it was quarried to Italy where it was cut, to New York where is was offloaded for shipment to Iowa. The granite could have been obtained from a quarry in Minnesota with much less shipment required. 2) Plant native plants, and don't irrigate them. 3) Insulate well. This includes using more reflective surfaces on our buildings to reflect heat in the summer. 4) Buy energy efficient fixtures. 5) Buy recycled products. Recycle our water where possible, including the use of "gray water" for toilets and irrigation.

Many of these actions require additional expenditures, but Rob reported that many

people are concerned about environmental quality and efficiency and want to patronize businesses that have LEED certification.
