Iowa National Guard Greater Des Moines

The March 9 program for Northwest Rotary was two gentleman from the Iowa National Guard. Captain Stanley Manus Chaplin, Major Matthew W. Stephenson. Both of these gentleman are full time guard members. The program was about the training before you are deployed and the "Reintegration The Challenge of the Road Home"

The soldiers will have 45 to 60 days of training before they are deployed to war and this training is 14 to 20 hours each and everyday to get them prepared for what will happen in the war zone. When they come back home they will have 7 days of decompression training to get them ready for going home. All of this training was started in 2000 when the Guard became such a large part of the fight force. With a lot of this coming from the Vietnam wars and the problems that soldiers had then. What training you need to do with Citizen-Soldiers is different from what the regular soldiers do when they come home. From Warrior to Citizen-Soldier, the Chaplin

talked about his job in listening and counseling soldiers after the pre training period when they come home for 30 days before they are deployed to counseling during the time at war and then the return getting



the citizen-soldier back into being a husband, father and getting back to work at his regular job.

This deployment was a mentoring and police job over in Afghanistan plus helping the locals do Economic building. One of the hardest items to work with is the local's pocketing so much money to be able to get jobs done. It was hard for them and a big job to track the dollars and still try and run a War. Also when working with the people over in Afghanistan and trying to train them when most are illiterate. We are glad they are home and hope that we can keep the Iowa Guard in Iowa for a long time now.

Rotary Receives About 2.5 Million United Airline Miles for Humanitarian Projects!

Thank you to all those at United -- including President and CEO Jeff Smisek -- for their generosity and the opportunity to participate in United's 10 Million Charity Miles Giveaway. And thank you to everyone who voted for us. We couldn't have done it without your participation and persistence.

For the miles giveaway, we officially came in second place and will receive 2,488,070 charity miles from United. Rotarians will use the miles for humanitarian missions, such as transporting sick children to hospitals.

Although the giveaway wasn't announced in advance, Rotarians and friends of Rotary quickly and enthusiastically got the word out through social media, and we went from 18th place to second place. This enabled us to receive a larger portion of the 10 million airline miles that United was donating. In addition, we congratulate the Shriners, who took first place.
