Scribbles Jeff Fleming Des Moines Art Center

Today was an eye opening and engaging program by Jeff Fleming, Executive Director of the Des Moines Art Center (founded in 1948). To get a more complete visual and inspirational impact of the art and architecture that distinguishes the Des Moines Art Center, visit www.desmoinesartcenter.org or visit the Center's three locations.

The Art Center presents thought-provoking exhibitions and educational programs, lectures, as well as hands-on studio art classes - all provided by 130 employees (55part time) on a \$5 million budget (1/2 from endowments and ½ from charitable support and earned revenues). In addition the Center is just completing a \$34 million "comprehensive" capital campaign (capital funding, endowment and annual funding combined). Interesting Fact: During the economic slowdown (2008-2009) attendance increased!

The Art Center's main physical complex marries with the collection for a totally integrated experience. The collection is housed in three major buildings; each designed by a world-renowned architect - Eliel Saarinen, I. M. Pei, and Richard Meier. Thousands of people visit Des Moines annually to see the art center's collection, famous architecture (each of the 3 buildings are seen around the world as architectural masterpieces), and/or to visit the new Sculpture Garden in Gateway West downtown. The Center rotates the portion of its collection on public display quarterly!

Recognized by international art critics as a world-class museum in the heart of the Midwest, the Des Moines Art Center has amassed an important collection with a major emphasis on contemporary art. The collection's overriding principle is a representation of artists of the 19th and 20th century ("art and artists of today and tomorrow"), each through a seminal work. This accounts for an impressive collection that ranges from Edward Hopper's Automat to Jasper Johns' Tennyson, Henri Matisse's Woman in White, Georgia O'Keeffe's From the Lake No. 1, and Francis Bacon's Study after Velásquez's Pope Х. Portrait of Innocent (The Screaming Pope - now valued at \$50 million to \$70 million).

The facilities are also available for rent for special occasions - perhaps an opportunity as a location for our club's quarterly social.

Rotary Minute...




Northwest Rotary was represented at the "Green Eggs and Ham Reach Out and Read Breakfast.

ROR-Iowa is part of the national Reach Out and Read pediatric literacy program that links literacy and health by incorporating books and literacy guidance into every well-child visit from 6 months through 5 years of age. Reach Out and Read is an evidence-based nonprofit organization that promotes early literacy and school readiness in pediatric exam rooms nationwide by giving new books to children and advice to parents about the importance of reading aloud.

In 2006, Rotary District 6000, representing 63 clubs in central and southern Iowa, stepped forward to match former Iowa First Lady Christie Vilsack's contribution to help expand Reach Out and Read Iowa by launching a "Rotarians for Reach Out and Read" campaign with a goal of donating \$30,000 for ROR children's books to support literacy. Rotarians responded by making generous donations to the Reach Out and Read Iowa Coalition and direct contributions to their local Reach Out and Read programs. The \$30,000 goal was surpassed, with District 6000 Rotarians contributing over \$34,000 that funded more than 14,000 books for young Iowa children. Rotary's commitment continues as Rotarians continue to support Reach Out and Read at the state and local levels through financial contributions, adoption of local ROR programs to help with books, volunteer readers, and literacy-rich waiting rooms; and spreading the word about Reach Out and Read in Iowa.

A wonderful example is the inaugural Charles Gabus Memorial Bike Ride held July 5th, 2009, at the Walker Johnson Park in Urbandale and following that city's trail system. Distance choices of 5 miles, 20 miles and even 60 miles were options for the 100 riders.
