Kimberly Hansen Rebuilding Together Greater Des Moines

Rebuilding Together Greater Des Moines is a 17 year old non-profit organization that helps low income and handicapped homeowners to maintain and modify their homes to fit their needs. Kimberly Hansen, Executive Director, and two part-time employees, run the organization with much of the grassroots work done by volunteers. Funding comes from three sources:

- 1. Corporate Sponsorship (60%)
- 2. State funding provides programs -Senior Emergency Home Repair Modification
- **3.** Private donations.

Since 1995, Rebuilding Together has repaired or rehabilitated more than 1000

homes adding over 6.5 Million to the real estate market value in the Des Moines area.

To highlight the impact in our community, Rebuilding Together has an annual work day on the first Saturday in May. Approximately 40 to 60 homes are repaired or improved with over 800 v olunteers working together to show support and commitment to these worthwhile projects. Other work days are sponsored by local companies such as Meredith, Wells Fargo, Choice Hotels, Sears and Lowe's.

Regardless of where or for whom revitalization is needed, Rebuilding Together Greater Des Moines, under the leadership of Kimberly Hansen has made differences in the lives of our citizens so that they may live with dignity.

Following a Patient Through Surgery


Jim Arthur recently returned from this year's District 6000 Iowa M.O.S.T (Miles of Smiles Team) trip to Guatemala. Below is Jim's narrative from the Miles of Smiles bloghttp://iowamost.blogspot.com: (I would encourage to check out this site for more information about the 2012 trip.):

"Today, Tuesday the 23rd, I was again struck by the dedication and skills of the team of people who make up M.O.S.T.. I saw 18 month old Glendy have her cleft palate repaired by the team led by Dr. Brian Andrews. Looking at the top of Glendy's mouth, you could see the hole in the top of the palate, and the entries into the nose were visible in the gap. Because of this she would never be able to be at ease eating in public because some of the food would come out of her nose. The cleft would make her voice sound funny when she talked causing her further grief. Slowly Brian and his team isolated the muscles under the tissues at the edges of the cleft and sewed the two sides of each together. Repair of the rearmost muscle will improve her ability to swallow. After 3 hours of surgery, Glendy had a roof in her mouth and moved to the recovery room.

Glendy was agitated and unhappy as she came out of the anesthetic. The nurses assisted by non-medical members of the team struggled with her to keep her from hurting herself and to prevent her from pulling out her iv tube or pulling off the monitors. She couldn't be released until she could maintain a proper oxygen level. It was slow to come up, and she struggled long and hard. Eventually tender loving care calmed her, and after an even longer time her oxygen level came up. It was a challenge for all concerned, but Glendy left the area calm and with a brighter future ahead of her.

I saw several other children come through recovery from surgery today. It was a moving day, one I will long remember."

We are proud of you Jim for being a part of this trip. Definitely an example of "Service Above Self."
