Tony Timm Central Iowa Shelter & Svs.

Tony Timm, the Director of Central Iowa Shelter & Services outlined the evolution of the Churches United Shelter which was put together very quickly to address dire needs into today's organization which is a multi-faceted approach to addressing homelessness in Des Moines.

The CISS accepts clients in any condition and will provide shelter for 90 days. Services are based on a case management approach that includes health care, legal aid, dental care, and education. Transportation is provided for those involved in education while subsidized transportation is available for those who are working. Most clients suffer from a combination of substance abuse, domestic abuse, and / or mental illness. Clients who are making progress towards goals established as part of their case management can earn additional days of

shelter services to help them get back on their feet.

CISS has beds for 68 men and 34 women. Additionally, 14 beds are reserved for veterans. Veterans can stay for up to 2 years, however, they must be clean & sober, must save at least 50% of their earnings.

CISS also serves between 8,000 and 9,000 meals per month. This effort helps to reduce homelessness by freeing up money that might otherwise go to food for maintaining the home they are currently in.

CISS can always use volunteers to help them fulfill their mission of providing homeless adults with shelter and meals while moving them towards self-sufficiency.


Rotary Minute...
