Kent Sovern Iowa Parks Foundation

Kent Sovern the Executive Director of the Iowa Parks Foundation was our speaker for today. He explained that the foundation is a philanthropic organization designed to be an independent voice for Iowans who support and use park lands and other publicly owned natural resources. We will organize and lead efforts to transform Iowa's parks for future generations. One focus will be to advocate for increased private and public funding in support of the environment and natural resources including parks in all jurisdictions.

The foundation has 3 principle goals - to CONNECT Iowans to the natural world; to TRANSFORM Iowa's parks to world class stature; and to CELEBRATE Iowa's proud history of natural resource conservation during the centennial of the state parks founding in 2020. As we advance these goals, new users will frequent the parks and the visitor experience will be dramatically improved. The foundation will not compete with the mission or programs of any other organization. We will collaborate and leverage the assets and strengths of these organizations while seeking their partnership to advance our mission.

This statewide initiative will assist local organizations when appropriate and will financially support local projects. The Foundation will support projects that advance a broader vision of state, county and municipal parks as a system rather than any "stand alone" project in an individual park.

The Foundation's work begins at this moment so that we have adequate time for

park system improvements to be planned, designed, financed, constructed and introduced to users. We intend to make our state park system's 100th anniversary in 2020 a celebration of success.

Rotary Minute...

Ocular health - Eyeglasses in History

Around AD 62, the Roman philosopher Seneca wrote of the magnifying properties of a water-filled glass ball. By 1000, Italian glass blowers had created "reading stones" similar to contemporary hand-held magnifying lenses. The exact date of the creation of reading lenses remains unknown, but reports from 1300 indicate that Germany, Italy, and the Netherlands manufactured and sold spectacles. Benjamin Franklin commissioned the first bifocals in 1760 for his own use.

The United States has 1 optometrist per 4,500 people. India has 1 per 100,000. Sub-Saharan Africa has 1 optometrist per 1 million individuals.

Since July 2004, The Rotary Foundation has awarded 265 humanitarian grants to support eye health, totaling \$3,091,552 in 43 countries, with projects in India receiving the most help.
