The PET Project Midwest

Thank you, Liz Nead, for introducing Courtney Tompkins, volunteer member, board of directors of The PET Project Midwest. Courtney introduced Brooklyn, her foster dog, which was rescued from Craigslist for \$30. Pet shelters are full and this organization addresses the problem by being proactive in dealing with abandoned pets. One service is The Iowa Pet Alert, an amber alert system for animals. Local authorities are making good use to supplement their limited resources for dealing with strays. The Pet Pantry provides food and supplies to owners in need. Pets are the first to go when loss of income occurs. This and Meals on Wheels for pets provide ongoing support for those unable to get pet The Habitat for Hounds reinforces care. happy, healthy families.

Courtney introduced Amy Heinz, Executive Director, AHeinz57 Pet Rescue and Transport, Inc. AHeinz57 is a non-profit, foster-based rescue organization in Adel. Fund raising,

public donations, and volunteers provide the funds for operations. No government money is involved. They bridge the



gap between traditional animal shelters and no-kill rescues by providing free transportation for dogs and cats from shelters to rescues over the Midwest and Canada. The Pit Stop, a temporary stop where the dogs get vetted and checked and get lots of attention from volunteers, is located in DeSoto. The foster-based program begins with taking in strays and pulling dogs out of shelters and places them in temporary homes. Once all vet care is taken care of, permanent homes are located through adoption events and posting online.
