MS Society of Central Iowa

After spending 25 years in the investment and insurance industry, Mark Davis made a life and career change and began working with the Multiple Sclerosis Society of Central Iowa. The Central Iowa chapter covers all of North Dakota, South Dakota and Iowa, as well as 6 counties in Minnesota and 1 county in Nebraska. With only 13 employees to support this effort, volunteers are essential to their efforts. In addition to their mission of mobilizing resources and volunteers to drive research for a cure and support systems, their vision is to make MS the "polio" of the 21st century.

MS is a chronic disease that attacks the insulation sheath that covers your nerves. There are such a large number of symptoms that occur when the flow of information between the brain and body is interrupted that physicians and experts

cannot predict what will happen to individuals. The focus of care is on disease modifying actions. Symptoms range from sensory and vision problems to speech challenges and weakness and paralysis.

There are four known courses of MS, relapsing-remitting, primary-progressive, secondary-progressive and progressive-relapsing, which strikes women 2-3 times more than men. Insurance coverage is focused on the largest population, the relapsing-remitting group. Drug therapies are quite expensive, with the cheapest starting at \$2000 a month.

Options for involvement are varied, from emotional support and chore services to direct financial assistance for the expensive drug treatments and medical equipment.
