Rodney Tomlinson Goodwill Industries

On Friday August 8th our guest speaker was Rodney Tomlinson, Community Development Manager for Goodwill Industries of Central Iowa. Rodney has been with Goodwill Industries for the last 7 years and was speaking today on the soon to be open relocated store in Urbandale.

The new store is located at 4520 Urbandale Drive in Urbandale. This building is being built as a replacement for their current location next to Hy-Vee on 86th. This is the third store they have been able to design and build rather than renting an existing space. There are 14 Goodwill Stores in central IA.

The square footage will increase from 10,000 to 15,000 square feet allowing for a 10,000 square foot selling floor and 5,000 square feet for backroom operations. The new location will also have 5 dressing rooms. This is a prototype store and will include easy access to a covered drop off area for donations. They are expecting between 25,000 and 30,000 donors during their first year.

The store will employ 25 to 30 people and will have 27,000 items on the floor for sale at any one time. It will also include a computer corner which will be part of their e-waste initiative. Those computers that can't be refurbished are parted out and sold to recycling companies. The program has kept 1 million pounds of computer waste out of the landfill since its inception 1 year ago. In total the 14 stores have been able to save 10,577,000 pounds of waste from going to our landfills, not only from computers but other items they have been able to sell to recycling companies.
