Club Service involves all of the necessary activities Rotarians perform to make their clubs function successfully.



Dr. Richard Deming

Mercy Medical Center

Dr. Deming joined Mercy medical Center in 1989 and has been changing lives in Central Iowa ever since. He is active in many professional oncology organizations and has been the recipient of numerous awards.

Dr. Deming's role as an avid adventurer led him to put together an event where he led 14 Cancer survivors and 15 caregivers to the 17,600 foot Base Camp of Mount Everest Along their journey the team laughed, they cried, and they survived. Then they returned home with a new sense of purpose and a

renewed belief that anything is possible.

One of the things he learned from all this is that "too much stuff is a burden." He also learned that "it is not getting to the top that matters it is what you learn about yourself along the way."



He told us that the team prepared both physically and mentally because this was not just a physical adventure but it was a mind body experience. In a similar way life is a team and is about facing adversity. Adversity leads to personal growth.


