Boys & Girls Club of Central Iowa

Nancy Johnson brought to us our speakers for today's program from the Boys and Girls Clubs of Central Iowa. Executive Director, Sam Carrell, and Director of Development Julie Moore's presentation dealt with the unique symbiotic relationship of BGCCI with the new Des Moines George Washington Carver Elementary School, where many of our members participate in the NW Des Moines Rotary Earn to Learn program. BGCCI's prior relationship at Wallace and Longfellow elementary schools led to a unique situation where the physical needs of BGCCI programs were included in the architectural design of the building. So now the students use the academic portion of the building during the school day, and then move to the BGC area for after school activities.

Boys & Girls Clubs is a youth development organization that empowers local youth to be successful, upstanding, and confident students and citizens. They offer after school and all day summer activities such as tutoring, leadership, sports, and arts opportunities in a safe supportive environment.

The clubs serve youth ages 5-18 years, and are strategically located in neighborhoods where children have few options for positive non-school activities or lack the resources to take advantage of what's available.

Presently BGCCI serves 5500 club members in central Iowa.

Boys & Girls Clubs have an impact on the community: 1. The vast majority of the clubs alumnae report that being club members during their childhood literally saved their lives. 2. That club staff helped them learn right from wrong. 3. The club was the best thing available in their community. 4. 91% of club members

graduate from high school compaired to 50% of their peers, and 26% go on to college.


Rotary Minute...
