Rotary Program

Rotary has many different programs that encourage adults and youth to participate in. While many are very much established and rich in tradition, RotaKids, is one that is very new and targets a new age group of kids to get involvement from.

Loring Miller, Rotarian from Decatur County, and Bob Herrick, Rotarian from Boone County, and the husband of District Governor Susan Herrick, presented a program that is new to Rotary. The RotaKid program is an exciting new venture that gets kids in the 4th, 5th, and 6th grades involved to build self-esteem and to create service projects that promotes service to others. RotaKids involves local clubs and school administrators that is student lead. The students help each other develop leadership skills by helping each other promote selfawareness and creating projects that can help others.

RotKids was started in Florida in 2000 and has started to spread with popularity across the globe and United States. Although RotaKids is not yet recognized as an official program of Rotary International, leaders are hopeful that within a short time, it too will become one of the programs that Rotary can promote in its literature.

- 5. Student selecton

- 7. Project involvement



Rotary Minute...

Rotary's Official Mottos

Rotary's official mottoes, Service Above Self and They Profit Most Who Serve Best, trace back to the early days of the organization.

In 1911, He Profits Most Who Serves Best was approved as the Rotary motto at the second convention of the National Association of Rotary Clubs of America, in Portland, Oregon. It was adapted from a speech made by Rotarian Arthur Frederick Sheldon to the first convention, held in Chicago the previous year.

The Portland convention also inspired the motto Service Above Self. During a convention outing on the Columbia River, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA, talked with Seattle Rotarian J.E. Pinkham about the proper way to organize a Rotary club, offering the principle his club had adopted: Service, Not Self. Pinkham invited Paul P. Harris, who also was on the boat trip, to join their conversation. Harris asked Collins to address the convention, and the phrase Service, Not Self was met with great enthusiasm.

At the 1950 RI Convention in Detroit, slightly modified versions of the two slogans were formally approved as the official mot-toes of Rotary: He Profits Most Who Serves Best and Service Above Self. The 1989 Council on Legislation established Service Above Self as the principal motto of Rotary, because it best conveys the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service. He Profits Most Who Serves Best was modified by the 2004 Council to its current wording, They Profit Most Who Serve Best.
