Burro BBQ draws applause from young, old alike

The longest-running annual event in the city's history once had participants racing burros down the streets to later marinate and barbecue them in a deep pit.

The animal still appears on booklets and posters for this year's 57th Annual Burro BBQ, but beef was the meat on offer at Bullhead Community Park as hundreds lined up for \$5 sandwiches on Saturday and a day of live music, crafts and booths.

A fundraiser for the Bullhead City Rotary Club, the event raised about \$25,000 last year with proceeds going to anything from scholarships to building water wells.

Some preliminary BBQ numbers

So far we have collected \$3,650 of the \$21,450 in ads that were sold for the Burro Sheet.

Income from food sales was \$8,861. Beer income was \$1,857, wine was \$354, sodas and water produced \$737. Income from the youth area activities was \$1,644. Golf night brought in another \$650. So far we have netted \$4,160 from the raffle. We also raised \$600 from the entertainment sponsors.
