### Reciprocal Matching Grants work Rotary magic

She is pictured here with me signing the Rotary Matching Grant documents, on behalf of our respective clubs, that will help to accomplish a huge amount of good in a school here in Bullhead City, along with one in Cuernavaca.

Our club's project is the extending of the WeekEND Hunger backpack food program to the Coyote Canyon School, where it is badly needed. We will be partnering locally with the Communities in Schools in Southern Nevada and the Colorado River Region. This organization has already established the program in the Mountain View School, along with one in Laughlin, and another in Fort Mohave. It is achieving impressive results with the children who have been served.

The Cuernavaca club's project involves providing badly needed physical therapy equipment to a very special school that specializes in the early detection and treatment of physical and mental disabilities. The specialists in this school work together with the children and their parents to help these special kids reach their greatest potential.

Our club's total investment in these projects will be \$6,000. With the leveraging of the Matching Grants program of our Rotary Foundation, nearly \$30,000 in services will be provided to these two schools in our communities.

You will be hearing more about both of these projects in the coming months -- and how you can become personally involved.

#### Reading project announced

Willie Richardson gave us a preview at our meeting last Thursday of a brand new, hands-on project in which you and your spouse can both become involved.



We are being asked to devote some time on a weekly basis to sit and listen to 3rd graders read at the Desert Valley Elementary School.

As Willie explained to us, the average 3rd grader is capable of reading at the rate of approximately 90 words per minute. Some of these students are struggling to read at the rate of 10 words per minute.

Sign-up sheets and times will soon be available. Watch for them -- and plan to get involved in this very worthwhile project. YOU can make a significant difference in some of these young lives.

For any of the newer members who don't know her, Willie is Jim Richardson's wife. She and Jim are both serving on our Foundation Committee this year.
