### What is the Paul Harris Society?



Most of our club members are know what a Paul Harris

**Fellowship is.** It is an award made to any person who contributes \$1,000 or more to The Rotary Foundation's Annual Programs Fund. That \$1,000 contribution can be cumulative. It does not have to be donated all at once, or even within a single year. Many of our members have \$25 or more for the Foundation added to their quarterly club dues, to help them work toward their goal of receiving a Paul Harris Fellowship. In fact, some of our members have already reached their first \$1,000 and are working toward multiple Paul Harris Fellowships.

The Paul Harris Society represents another level of support for The Rotary Foundation. There are those of us who feel so strongly about the value and work of our Foundation that we have committed \$1,000 or more per year to TRF. Those who have made such a commitment are recognized as member of The Paul Harris Society. While the Foundation awards Paul Harris Fellowships, the records of Paul Harris Society members are kept by each Rotary district, and those diistricts recognize these PHS members by presenting to them a distinctive pen.
