International racing event is in our backyard



Roger Allison opened our eyes last week to a worldfamous event that few locals realize has been happening in our backyard now for 10 years.

The Laughlin International Rally brings racing teams and rally enthusiasts each year from across America and around the world. It has become so large that it requires at least 400 volunteers to help put it on.

In addition to the International Rallying motor sport competition (which requires a 2-person team, driving many of the most scenic back roads in northwestern Arizona), there is a GPS Adventure Rally (in which drivers & passengers use a GPS unit to find the secret route), a Rally-moto/cross event for motorcycles, the Pro-Am Drift Finals, Auto Cross (testing drivers' skils on a pavement course with hundreds of cones), Rally Cross (like a slalom or an autocross on a timed dirt course), SuperStage, the final competition leg of the rally, and a number of other festival activities.

Sarah's House offers victim support

Our thanks to Sheila King for sharing with us the story of Sarah's House, founded in Mohave County in 2000 to offer support to victims of child abuse and domestic violence. This crisis center, presently housed at 1770 Airway Avenue in Kingman, has developed into a fully operational forensic examination and crisis support facility for victims of crime and other crisis circumstances in Mohave County.

Sarah's House, which has provided services to over 2500 victims, now offers a multi-disciplinary approach in dealing with cases of family violence including domestic violence, sexual assault, elder abuse, child molestation and child maltreatment.

It is their goal to provide numerous quality services at one central location. This prevents re-victimization of the victim and their family. They treat each individual with courtesy, respect and compassion. They offer 24/7 crisis intervention in such varied circumstances as helping families to deal with death notifications, in-home deaths, suicides, vehicular deaths, SIDS deaths, fires and rollover accidents.

Laughlin Rotary Club Receives CAA Award

Local stars lit up the Colorado River sky on Saturday, June 9th, as the Laughlin Chamber of Commerce presented its 10th Annual Community Achievement Awards. The CAA awards recognize individuals, businesses and organizations in the Tri-State area that donate their time and money to benefit the river communities and their residents.

Among the award recipients was the Rotary Club of Laughlin for "Community Service Organization of the Year." From the four non-profit organization finalists, the Rotary Club was recognized for its Laughlin Educational Mini Grants program, which provides teachers with up to \$300 for non-funded projects. This year alone, over \$8,000 was awarded to elementary and junior/senior high school teachers. The Laughlin Rotary Club funded eight student scholarships this year - to date helping 56 graduating seniors pursue higher education. President Thane O'Brien was on hand to accept the award on behalf of the club along with several Rotary members.

"We thank the businesses and individuals in the community that support Rotary. Your donations and participation toward our fund raising efforts allow us to help our local youth in becoming better citizens," O'Brien said.
