Lee targets saving kids

Speaking at Arizona PETS, SETS and More last weekend in Mesa, Rotary International Presidentelect Dong Kurn Lee said he was in disbelief when he

learned that 30,000 children under the age of five die every day from preventable diseases such as pneumonia, diarrhea, measles, and malaria.

"Once I understood the issues behind that terrible number, I knew what I needed to do," Lee said. He told the incoming Rotary club officers he will keep the service emphases of recent years - water, health and hunger, and literacy - but asked them to focus their efforts in each of these areas - on children.

Rotary International's Health and Hunger Resource Group will be sharing information regarding a new United Nations initiative called REACH (Renewed Efforts Against Child Hunger). Millions of children worldwide are victims of chronic hunger and undernutrition:

Currently, undernutrition contributes to more than three million preventable child deaths each year.

The poverty cycle is perpetuated by undernutrition and hunger through reduced physical growth, lower capacity for intellectual development, and poor economic productivity.

The UN estimates that the direct cost of not addressing child hunger and undernutrition is US\$20 to \$30 billion annually.

To tackle these issues, the UN World Food Program (WFP), UNICEF, and WHO are launching Renewed Efforts Against Child Hunger (REACH), which is aimed at halving the number of underweight children by 2015,

REACH will help achieve the first Millennium Development Goal, which is to: Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger.

The initiative will also mobilize political support, secure financial resources, and establish partnerships to raise awareness - and promote solutions - to curtail child hunger and undernutrition. REACH will focus on reducing undernutrition and hunger among children in target countries, which may include one or more

polio-endemic countries.

WFP, UNICEF, WHO, and other key agencies will lead efforts to support cost-effective national and community programs that can have an immediate impact on children and mothers, such as:

Micronutrient fortification and supplementation

Ready-to-use therapeutic foods

Household water treatment

Hand-washing with soap

Parasite control measures (particularly de-worming and bed nets)

Household food security measures such as homestead food production.

Incidentally, the year D.K. Lee served as a District Governor, he managed to add *38 new Rotary clubs* in
